We at Vicharta Samuday Samarthan Manch – VSSM, are working for the betterment of most neglected nomadic & de-notified tribes since 2010. The areas of our interventions include Human Right Programme, Housing Support, Livelihood – Income Generation Programme, Education Initiative and Environment Conservation activities. All these initiatives significantly are focused on,

- Changing the mind set of these communities & improve their living conditions;
- To mobilize government machinery for inclusion of these communities for welfare measures and upliftment
- To pave a smooth access for availing basic identities like Voter ID; BPL Card and other beneficiary schemes;
- To provide security cover and permanent settlement with basic amenities of water, light etc.
- Education for their children – the future of the deprived communities .
- We have holistic development of Nomadic, De-Notified and Deprived communities as our mission so that they can have a dignified and stable life for future generations also.





VSSM's Vision

The Nomadic and De-notified tribes attain identity and live a dignified life.

VSSM's Mission

VSSM strives to create an empathetic social and political environment that is willing to enable inclusive growth of the Nomadic and de-notified communities. Simultaneously, design community-based interventions that triggers a progressive change from within.

Who are the nomadic and de-notified communities?

The various communities of Nomadic and De-Notified Tribes (NT-DNT) are some of the extremely marginalized people of India. The mention of NT-DNT evokes a sense of mystic and intrigue. They were our wandering tribes, the gypsies. In the bygone days their skills and crafts were revered; the dexterous services they offered were unmatched and were adored for the entertainment they provided. We have seen, felt and heard their presence in our cities and countryside till early or mid 80s. But the industrialization and modernization has proven to be a bane rather than a boon for these communities. The technological innovations literally shattered their traditional occupations. These communities, which were such an integral part of the economy in the past, have been forgotten.

Human Rights

The Human Rights program/initiatives are the most fundamental yet the most challenging activities of VSSM. They are the base upon which we design our future approach and build other interventions. Once the community members have their citizenry documents on hand we can work towards getting them a residential plot, building a house, starting a steady livelihood, educating their children... in short, help them progress in life.

This year the Pandemic response and its aftermath remained at the forefront of our activities. The pace and progress of work at the government offices has also slowed down as a result of pandemic related interruptions. It has had an impact on VSSM's flow of work as well.

Kit Distribution in response to Covid-19

The major part of our time this year has been spent in responding to the pandemic related issues. As mentioned under the pandemic response details, food kits worth Rs. 70.43 lakh were distributed. The distribution was carried out through the months of April and May 2020, we could distribute to 17,497 Ration Kits. Out of these, 9919 kits were distributed by VSSM (the cost was incurred by VSSM). 7578 kits were provided ready-made by our well-wishers.

Snake Park to come up in Dharampur, Valsad.

VSSM has been advocating for the need of rehabilitating the Vadi community who have lost a significant part of their culture and reason of existence to the implementation of Wildlife Protection Act 1972. One of the demand VSSM made was launching a snake park in lines of Irula Cooperative Society in Tamil Nadu. The government of Gujarat did listen to our repeated requests and approved a Snake Park and Snake Research Institute in Dharampur, Valsad. The establishment of the Snake Park was announced in October 2019. The General Resolution regarding the same was passed in March, 2020 by the State Government





Received Residential plots

VSSM is very vocal about the need for the nomadic communities to lead settled lives and the support it needs for the government, authorities and civil society to be able to do so. The communities face a lot of dissent when it comes to allotment of plots in revenue villages. However, thanks to the continuous follow up by VSSM, things are gradually changing in favour of the nomadic communities. This year the number of plots allotted are as under:

The collector of Surendranagar District provided Residential plots to 2500 families from Nomadic and De-notified Communities in the last two years.





Introducing Sukanya Yojana in Ramdevnagar, Ahmedabad



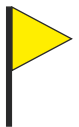
The Central Government has introduced a scheme named Sukanya Yojana under which the Government provides funds to girl child from the age of 10 till they reach the age of 18. This scheme is available to two daughters per household between the age of 0 years to 10 years. This Scheme enables the families to save money for their daughters' higher education and marriage. Under the scheme, the parents are required to deposit a

minimum Rs.250 to maximum 1.50 lac per annum in the bank account opened in the name of their daughter. By the end of the term, when the girl turns 18, this amount will mature and can be withdrawn at the current interest rate. Our team at the grassroots has filled the forms of 40 girls and brief on this method of savings to their families. So far, 21 Sukanya accounts have been opened.

Covid Response

This year certainly began with a bang. The COVID pandemic has been unsettling for everyone, more so for the poor. The initial lockdown to curb the spread of the virus was much needed but it adversely impacted the livelihoods of the daily wage-earning families. The Nomadic and De-Notified communities fall into this daily wage-earning category. The lockdown came as a massive blow to them. The closure of the economy meant they had no work therefore, no money to bring food to the family at the end of the day. Within a couple of days into the lockdown, VSSM started receiving phone calls appealing for ration. We were not prepared for this eventuality as it does not have a corpus to mitigate such unforeseen situations.

The government was prompt in activating its PDS machinery. Wheat, rice, pulses and sugar was made available through the PDS stores. If and when there were gaps, we had our grassroots team and volunteers who helped identify the needy. We began directing the gaps to the concerned district collectorates or any voluntary organisation working in the region. The government administration and voluntary groups were quick in their response to mitigate these gaps. Everyone was trying their best to ensure that the poor do not go to sleep hungry.

During the first phase, by coordinating with the government machinery and with the help of the civil society VSSM could channelize food for 25000 families and connected thousands of families with community kitchens run by voluntary groups.

The offers to provide support to curate ration-kits to supplement the ration received from the PDS stores consistently grew. The VSSM curated ration-kit containing items as follow

The Pandemic has been a disaster of a different kind. The natural calamity does not paralyse the entire system, it impacts and halts the affected regions but the COVID Pandemic has derailed the entire nation and world. During the unprecedented lockdown, it was impossible to function to respond to the cry for food. Thanks to the supportive and responsive local administration and voluntary efforts by the civil society, VSSM could reach 17497 families and give 17497 -grain kits

If we were to consider the family size of 4 and average ration kit feeds a family of 4 for ten days, 2 meals per day, meals were arranged for 25000 families means 1,00,000 individuals for 20 meals i.e. approximately 20 lakh meals.



Swavlamban

Swavlamban is VSSM's flagship program to provide interest-free microcredit to the nomadic and de-notified communities to inject life into their sluggish occupations. The loans are offered to revamp or restore their tattered livelihoods, to help the extremely poor families break free from the clutches of private money lenders.

Currently, the total number of loans is 3321. The principle amount is around Rs. 3.39 crores, which has grown to become a revolving fund of Rs. 9.51 crores. We aim to take principle amount to Rs. 4 crores.

This year, apart from livelihood regeneration, loans have also been extended for the following:

Loan for Livelihood during Covid-19 lockdown



This Pandemic has spared none. Even those with established and stable incomes are reeling under rough times due to the lockdown and slowing of the economy. While the poor are facing the worst times due to the current market conditions.

The nomadic families we work with have lost their incomes too, in absence of savings to fall upon these are challenging times for them.

The daily wage-earning families have a habit of buying their groceries daily, absence of income means no food at the end of the day. This section of our society faced a major food crisis during the lockdown.

VSSM decided to offer loans to 113 individuals who were facing a financial crisis because their livelihoods were badly impacted by the pandemic. These individuals also happen to be ones whom VSSM has provided loans previously and always paid instalment on time. Lockdown and economic slowdown have eaten up their savings. To ease the burden of payment of instalments we have fixed the amount to Rs. 400/-. As of now, we are receiving regular instalments on these loans.



Extending loans for storing grains



As soon as the lockdown was lifted, VSSM provided interest-free loans to 180 families to buy and store the grains for the next six months. If these 180 families show prudence by storing well and saving to pay off the loan, we may offer loans to more families in the coming future.

Formation of Sakhi Mandals in Ramdevnagar under Mission Mangalam Yojana

VSSM has been working with the idea of holistic development of the communities. Over some time, we have realized that if the woman of the family is financially empowered and learns the financial planning, she can lead the family to a brighter future. To teach financial planning to women of Nomadic and De-Notified Communities, we have started Bachat Mandal/Sakhi Mandal. We introduced this initiative first to the Bawri women of Ramdevnagar settlement of Ahmedabad who had strongly fought against the rampant menace of hooch and Ganja in the settlement. These Bachat Mandals have been opened in collaboration with the Government's Mission Managal Scheme where each woman in the group has to deposit Rs. 200/- every month for six months in the Bank account of the Mandal. After the initial six months, the Government gives them the loan of Rs. 1 lakh. The saving should go on even during the loan repayment. The government may also provide them with a loan of as high as Rs. 5 lakhs. The added advantage is the women of these Bachat Mandal also get priority on access to various welfare schemes by the government. In Ramdevnagar, the loans given for grain storage are only to the women associated with the Bachat Mandal. VSSM, has successfully formed 10 sakhi mandals with ten women in each group.



Challenges:

- Due to the Covid induced lockdown, we have seen a fall in the repayments of loans. However, the loanees have assured us that they will resume regular payments as soon as their businesses are stable once again.
- Many nomadic families continue to live itinerant lifestyles to earn their living. They load the material and set out to sell it, only to return once the material is sold out completely. Under such conditions, it is difficult to track down those loanees.

Further Planning:

1. We aim to take principle amount to Rs. 4 crores.
2. Drawing cue from the Bachat Mandal of Ramdevnagar, we plan to take the savings group program to other regions. VSSM sees the Bachat Mandal as the collective which can later work to represent their issues. We are also planning to invite loan applications only through Bachat Mandal.
3. We plan to disburse 700 more loans in the coming year.
4. We plan to expand the geographical reach of Swavlamban to Kheda district.

Education

The hostels had been functioning like a well-oiled machine, children preparing for the upcoming annual exams, the education team providing the required coaching and the scouting for colleges to enrol the children who were finishing school. It was mid-March when the pandemic restrictions arrived in India. The countrywide lockdown was announced. All education institutions including government schools were shut until further notice. They continue to remain closed and children study from home through online classes, easy for the children with an economically sound background. The children under VSSM's care are not equipped to study from home, they need extra support and coaching to cope with the curriculum.

The team has been struggling to resolve multiple challenges our children encounter with online learning:

Not all children have access to smart phones or electronics like Tablet or Computer.

- Access to the internet or mobile data is also not as convenient as it is for children from the economically sound background.
- Understanding or grasping what is taught online is not easy for them.
- They cannot always comprehend the study material sent to them online.
- Usually, it is the father who keeps the phone, so if he steps out of the house for work carrying the phone along, the children cannot study.

VSSM's education team has been trying its best to ensure that the children continue attending the online classes

It has asked parents to get a minimum recharge of Rs. 200 a month.

- The parents should ensure that the phone remains with the child when they have submissions or some tests.
- They have been asked to watch the lesson videos until they could comprehend them well.
- If the network is an issue, we have asked them to find a spot that receives proper signals and finish that classes at the same spot.
- The newly appointed Education in-charge has devised a mechanism to monitor the progress of every child. The team has also devised ways to continuously coach these children, by providing them with remedial lessons.
- The team has also introduced teaching soft skills like calligraphy, Mahendi application etc.
- To keep the learning atmosphere interesting, the children are encouraged to keep a daily journal, participate in online games of puzzles and charades.

The results of grade 10th and 12th have improved consistently. The table below shows the progress of our children through past three years

Participatory Water Management

Under the efficient guidance of VSSM's friend-philosopher and guide, Shri Rashminbhai Sanghvi, we embarked upon the journey of Participatory Water Management. The initiative aims to increase water sufficiency by desilting and deepening the village lakes in Banaskantha, one of the most water starved district of Gujarat. Once the lakes are able to capture and hold more rainwater, the ground water tables will improve over time. The efforts are weaved in a way that would enable us voice the concerns of nomadic, de-notified and other marginalised communities living in the villages, initiate a dialogue with the village leadership on the challenges these communities faced and to increase their inclusiveness in the region.

The Approach

VSSM begins with initiating a dialogue about water with the community leaders and village elders. It talks about the status of water in their region, the need to collectively work towards addressing the issue of water in their respective villages, how VSSM and local communities can collectively work together to recharge the groundwater tables. During these interactions, VSSM also talks about the state of the marginalised people of their villages.





Challenges

Over the last five years, the idea of water conservation has grown to a reality, of course with its fair set of challenges. However, we have not allowed the challenges to overwhelm us the remained perseverant because we dream of a greener and water sufficient Banaskantha.

- Instead of duplicating the scarce financial resources, VSSM has decided to collaborate with the Government under its Sujalam Suflam Scheme. Thus, when we went to any village where the lake was listed in the Sujalam Sufalam list, the people from the village expected that they will also get some money/kick back. “What will be our share?” were the questions popped at us, if the village leadership agreed to lake deepening under the scheme.
- There have been instances of VSSM being constantly scrutinized and facing distrust when it came to onsite work, the leaders felt it was not working in advantage of the in the lake and giving it shape or deepening it. People kept insisting on digging in the manner they want it to be dug
- This year the pandemic and the maintain the protocol and care has affected the logistics of the program. The supervisors were either not offered food and water onsite or the supervisors were too afraid to food offered to them by the communities. Some had to sleep under the open sky in absence of boarding facilities.
- The pandemic has affected the incomes of the communities everywhere. This has adversely impacted the community contribution in each village.





Achievement

- This year the Rain Gods have been generous and the region received good rains, filling up 10-12 lakes in Banaskantha.
- We could dig 3,37,892 CMT soil this year

Planning

- In the second season of Financial Year 2020-21, we aim to deepen 32 lakes till March, 2021
- We plan to take the water conservation efforts to the district of Surendranagar.
- We plan to launch a Jal Yatra- to make 'ideal village' 25 village with all environment conservation initiatives
- Lobbying with the Government to link the lakes with the Narmada Canal so that they get filled more than once a year. This will help raise the ground water tables as well as help the farmers irrigate their farms.
- To encourage and promote supportive conduct we plan to launch awards for villages and its leadership in the villages taking proactive measures to save water.

Tree Plantation Campaign

With the objective to increase the green cover of the water starved and drought prone regions, VSSM has initiated Tree Plantation Campaign in Banaskantha district. So far, we could plant 48,942 in 22 villages.

Achievements that have encouraged us this year are

- Trees of last year became one year old. They are looked after well and we are confident that they will not burn now.

We have received exceptional support from people from the village

- We have planted 11,000 plants and out of that only 57 could not survive. The people of the village have agreed to provide support towards installing drip irrigation system.
- In Makhanu village the community contributed Rs. 2 lacs for protecting and planting the trees in their village.





The efforts have had its share of Challenges

- -VSSM plans to plant trees native to the land and regions, trees that attract birds and bees but, there is a continuous unavailability of those trees from the Government nursery
- Logistical challenges like finding labour to load the saplings from the nursery into the truck as well as transporting them to the site. Transportation charges are quite high.
- At some places, the saplings were either stolen or destroyed.
- The villagers abruptly stop paying for the Vruksha Mitra, we could only provide the salary as long as the contributed funds were available. Sometimes the Sarpanch gives money from his funds or the organization contributes.

Planning for the upcoming year

- Focus to select and develop 25 villages as ideal villages for environment conservation activities.
- Plant 1 lakh trees.



Mavjat Karykram- Eldery Assistance

In its efforts to provide dignified living to all age groups of the nomadic communities, VSSM initiated Mavjat – senior care centres to provide food and support to the aging and destitute individuals from nomadic and other marginalised communities. The number of these elderly is raising (after careful scrutiny). This year as a result of the pandemic this group needed special attention.

Enabling the nomadic and de-notified communities leading an itinerant lifestyle find a permanent address, a home has been one of the highest priorities of VSSM. Our continued efforts have helped 938 nomadic families find a permanent address. This year the 1054 families we work with have obtained residential plots from the government.

Construction at Rajkot's Beti Rampara



This year our focus has been on the commencing construction in the Bawri settlement of Kubliyapara, in the heart of Rajkot city. The Bawri families are extremely poor, earning their living from selling balloons, plastic chairs or take up menial jobs for a daily wage. These families continue to lead a nomadic life.

After VSSM came into contact with them in 2013, it helped them acquire the basic identity

proofs. In 2016, 123 families applied for the allotment of residential plots. As it is with most applications in the government, these applications too kept getting pushed and stalled until January 2020 when 98 families received orders from the government about the allocation of residential plots in an area known as Beti Rampara. We are still following up with the remaining applications.

Each plot is 41.82 sq. mts. in size, enough to accommodate a room, a kitchen, a toilet block and a front yard.

These families have also received the benefit of Pandit Dindayal Awas Yojana which includes the grant of Rs. 1.20 lakh in three instalments. 68 families out of 98 have already received this amount. VSSM is also going to apply for the NREGA grant of Rs. 20,000/-.

A standard liveable house can be constructed at the cost of Rs. 2.30 lacs per house. If we consider the help of Rs. 1.40 lakh to be received from the Government, there is still a deficit for Rs. 90,000/- per house. VSSM will support the families by providing Rs. 40,000 each while the remaining required amount will be contributed by the beneficiaries.

VSSM has decided to begin the construction of 58 houses out of these 68 families in the first phase of construction. VSSM is extending help of Rs. 40,000/- per house to 58 families as the first phase of construction.

Kakar Sanitation Unit

Under the Swachh Bharat Mission, sanitation units have been constructed for the Vadi families at Kakar settlement. Under this scheme, the government provides Rs. 12,000/- per family to construct a sanitation unit. When the houses of 58 beneficiaries were under construction, we also included the construction of the sanitation units along with it. VSSM has provided Rs. 4000/- to support the construction and the community will contribute the remaining Rs. 4000.

Rehabilitation Efforts In Vadia

- The families of Vadia are learning to live with their adopted occupations. It is a gradual process but we are glad families are holding on and working hard to earn their living in a dignified manner.
- VSSM extended loans to 218 families so far.
- Two families have moved to neighboring village to venture into farming and cattle rearing. VSSM has provided them interest free loans to begin these ventures.
- VSSM also facilitated construction of 11 houses in Vadia during 2019.
- Two girls were married during 2020, one to her longtime customer and partner she loved. There was some resistance from the family, which was resolved by VSSM and the marriage was held in Ahmedabad. Another marriage was held in Palanpur.
- Two girls were engaged in 2019. It should be noted that engagements and weddings prevent elders from pushing girls into prostitution. VSSM encourages girls in Vadia to receive education and get married to prevent them from being forced into prostitution.
